

STUDENT Resource Update: HEERF II COVID-19 Emergency Relief Funding Exhausted—April 26, 2021

Dear NMC Students-

In mid-February, NMC received its allocation of HEERF II COVID-19 Emergency Relief Funds. Since, NMC has worked to distribute over \$360,000 in student emergency financial aid grants. HEERF II funds were meant to provide short-term assistance to students. This message is notification that available HEERF II funds have been exhausted and HEERF II applications are now closed.

NMC recognizes that many of you continue to face challenges due to COVID-19. In the coming weeks, I will be announcing an opportunity for additional student emergency grant funding provided through the American Rescue Plan (ARP) signed into law on March 11, 2021. The ARP provides for education stabilization through emergency funding to institutions of higher education through Higher Education Emergency Relief Funds (HEERF III).

Once available and in accordance with federal regulations, NMC will make HEERF III financial aid grants to students, which can be used for any component of the student's cost of attendance or for emergency costs that arise due to coronavirus, such as **tuition**, **food**, **housing**, **health care** (including mental health care), or child care. NMC will prioritize students with exceptional need. HEERF III COVID-19 emergency relief funds also allows for emergency grants to students exclusively enrolled in distance education. Students will again have the option to have relief funds to apply directly to their student accounts. The NMC COVID-19 Resource webpage will be updated as information becomes available regarding eligibility, application and grant distribution.
